

Message from Mary Anne Malone, Parish Life Coordinator

The feast day of St. Kateri Tekakwitha is July 14. At her canonization in 2012, Pope Benedict XVI prayed, "St. Kateri, protectress of Canada and the first Native American saint, we entrust to you the renewal of the faith in the First Nations and in all of North Americal" Born in 1656 in present-day New York State, Kateri was orphaned by a smallpox outbreak which left her disfigured. She was raised by relatives

who tried to arrange a marriage for her, but she refused all suitors. Kateri was baptized by Jesuit missionaries when she was 19. She was a model of prayer, kindness and hard work. Because she was so devoted to her faith, she was rejected by her Mohawk community. She traveled to a mission near Montreal where she lived a life of prayer and self-mortification. Kateri died at the age of 24. She is the patroness of ecology and the environment, people in exile and Native Americans. St. Kateri Tekakwitha, pray for us.
