**A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE:** Once a week in an old cast-iron skillet, I make an Irish soda bread. The ingredients are very simple: flour, sugar, salt, buttermilk and baking soda. It traditionally has the mark of the Cross on top. The priests and the staff seem to enjoy it. Each week on the altar we also have a very special bread. Its ingredients are simple flour and water. There is a Cross on the top.

What makes this bread so different are the special words of institution said by the priest on the altar. It is transformed from bread to the Body of Christ. This weekend the church celebrates the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. As you approach the altar to receive Jesus, know that it REALLY IS Him! Do you believe? **Message from Mary Anne Malone, Parish Life Coordinator**

St. Aloysius Gonzaga was born into a wealthy family in Italy in 1568. He had a spiritual awakening at the age of seven, and as a young boy, he dedicated himself to God through prayer, fasting and study of the lives of the saints. He was teaching catechism to the poor by the time he was eleven. He was called to the priesthood, but his father would not allow it. Instead, Aloysius became a page in the court of the Spanish nobility. When he was 18, his father relented and he entered the Jesuit order.

A plague broke out in 1587 and the Jesuits provided care for the victims. Aloysius worked tirelessly helping the sick until he himself contracted the deadly disease. He died at the age of 23. His Feast Day is June 21, and he is the patron saint of teenagers and seminarians. St. Aloysius, pray for us.
