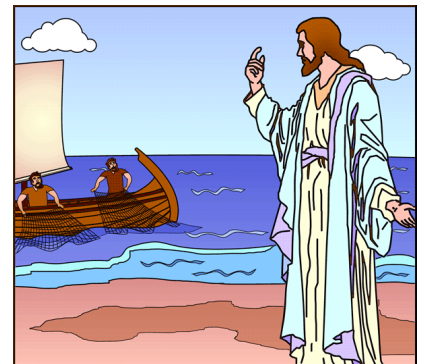

**A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MIKE:** I remember as a child the movie "Follow Me Boys." It starred Fred McMurry as a musician who comes to the town of Hickory and eventually becomes a Boy Scout leader.
