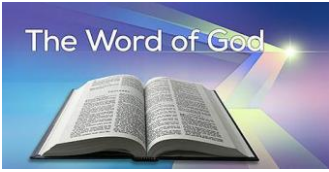
The next **Children's Mass** will be on November 21 at 10:15. The 7th grade students will lead us in prayer.
