LECTORS are needed for both masses. There is a sign-up sheet on the table in back of the church or you can call the office, 570-443-9944. Please consider this important ministry.

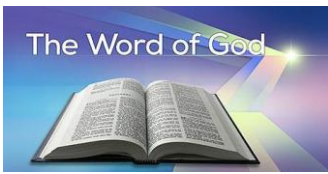
